# Clean Cities

- Nationwide program sponsored by the US Department of Energy (EPA Act 1992)
- Mission statement:  
*“advance the economic, environmental, and energy security of the US...by reducing petroleum consumption in the transportation sector.”*
- Network of ~90 volunteer groups (Coalitions) around the country

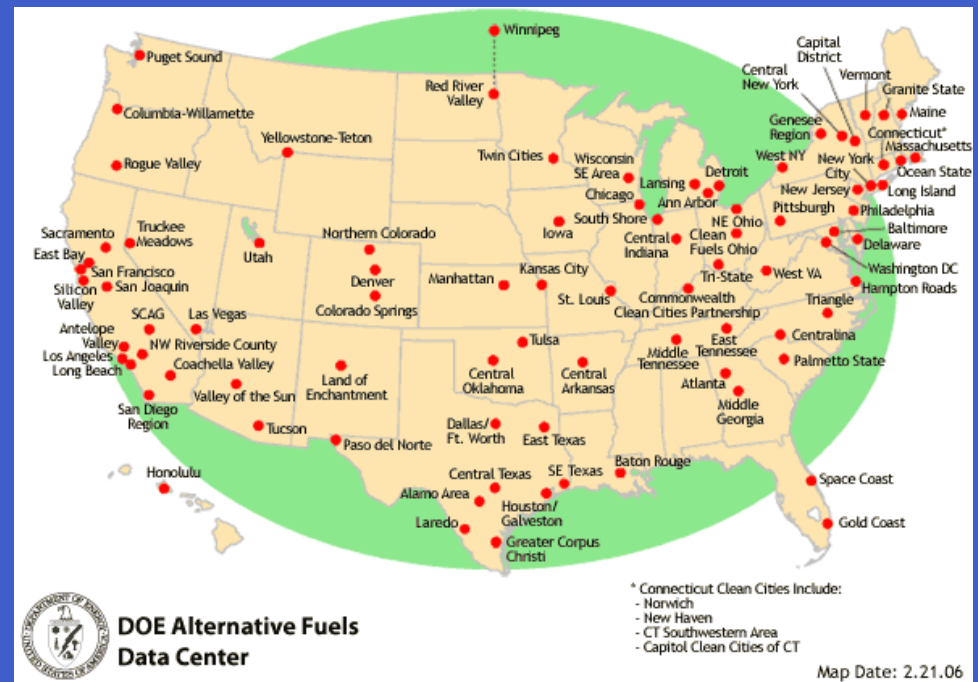

- Work on regional interests under national program's umbrella



# Puget Sound Clean Cities Coalition

- Officially designated as a Coalition by DOE in 1998 (redesignated in 2003).
- Initially, focused on King, Kitsap, Pierce and Snohomish Counties but has expanded into other areas, i.e. Jefferson County.

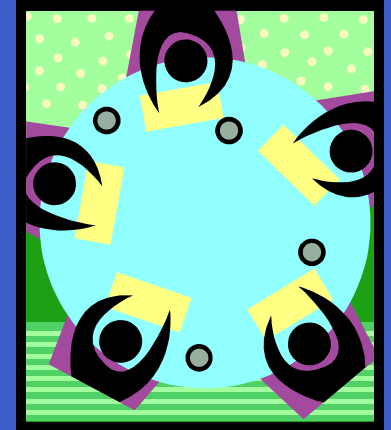

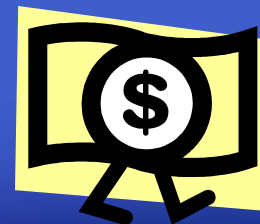
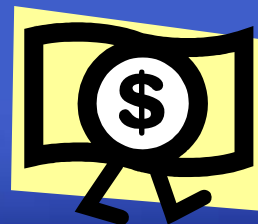
# Clean Cities Grant Program

- Applications must go through a Coalition

- **Traditionally,...**

- Category of Special Project under the State Energy Program
- Funds go through State Energy Office (WSU Extension Energy Program)
- Usual eligible project categories: alt fuel vehicles, alt fuel infrastructure, niche markets, Coalition support

- **Now...**



# 2006 CC Grant Program

- Various approaches have been considered but nothing is final.
- Latest information/rumors:
  - smaller pool of money
  - funds will not go through State Energy Office
  - encouraging multi-agency, multi-state proposals
  - likely won't include Coalition support
  - possible focus on E85 infrastructure
  - coming SOON...
